

### Are we running out of Forest?

Once upon a time you simply went out and bought wood, wherever it came from and however it was harvested.

However these days preserving the trees, woodlands and forests is an imperative and essential for the future survival of the human race and something we should all agree is important. As a result of this, buying wood has become quite a complex matter with a lot of grey areas.

### What is Illegal logging in Australia?

Illegal logging is very serious and a very real problem internationally and in Australia.

Promoting forest loss and damage and robbing developing nations of up to US\$30 billion in needed revenues each year.

Illegal loggers also have an unfair advantage over legitimate timber producers allowing cheap timber to flood the Australian Markets. They also mix in Illegal wood with legal wood.

It's for such reasons that it would be absurd for you buying timbers that you cannot track the chain of custody... Are you?





### What is Chain of Custody in Wood?

"The Chain of Custody Standard (AS 4707) provides all organisations in the wood or forest products certification chain with the minimum criteria and requirements to implement a credible system for the tracking of wood or forest products originating from certified forests through all phases of ownership, transportation and manufacturing to the end consumer" <a href="http://www.forestrystandard.org.au/">http://www.forestrystandard.org.au/</a>

### What does this mean to me?

When buying your timber for your decking project ask a couple of simple questions:

- Do you have a FSC Certification? If the answer is anything but yes don't buy the timber.
- Do you have chain of custody on your timbers and can I see it? – If the answer is I will get back to you or no don't buy the timber.

Remember, if you buy timbers that do not have the chain of custody or the people are not sure you ARE supporting illegal forestry.

### What is sustainable wood?

Sustainable wood comes from sustainably managed forests. It's renewable because the forest stewards manage the landscape to prevent damage to eco-systems, watersheds, wildlife and the trees themselves, taking a long term rather than short term view of the resource

Sustainable wood can also refer to buying locally to reduce the amount of energy consumed in harvesting, processing, and transporting wood materials.

Wood from unsustainable sources, on the other hand, is chopped down at will leaving large bare areas that unless they're carefully treated, never really recover. The effects are clear – illegal logging leads to wholesale destruction.



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### How to identify sustainable wood - The FSC

Always look for official certification of the wood's sustainable source, even if it says it's from the EU. There have been questions about wood from some EU sources, for example illegal logging has long been suspected in Russian and Siberian forests.



The Forest Stewardship Council

FSC – is an independent not for profit organisation promoting responsible management of the world's forests. Their certification system provides internationally recognised standard-setting and trademark assurance to anyone, business or individual, who is interested in supporting responsible forestry.



The FSC logo is something you can rely on, and there's also the PEFC logo, a sign that the Programme for the Endorsement of Forestry Certification has been involved.

Together they help guarantee wood comes from sustainable sources, replaced after harvesting, taken without harming the environment and neighbouring ecosystems.

### Why did we produce this Special Report?

We get frustrated by the lack of public knowledge of what is happening in the word of timber and continue to try and educate the public on this serious matter.

Often we get asked why are our timbers more stable and cost a little more than others the reason for this is we take great care with our imported timbers and local grown timbers to build strong relationships direct with the Mills and making sure they comply with sustainable forestry.

There are still people promoting, selling and installing timbers that are not from sustainable forests and they don't care because it's about price and profit. Everyone has a responsibility to make the world a better place for generations to come.
